MINUTES, LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, JANUARY 29, 2020

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from January 21, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. today at the Washington Street Courthouse Annex, 310 West Washington Street, Athens, AL.

Present: Daryl Sammet, Steve Turner, and Jason Black. Absent: Ben Harrison. Collin Daly, Chairman presided.

County Attorney Mark Maclin said he had circulated a draft of the terms to the commissioners to review of the lease agreement between the county and Sarrell Dental. The commissioners discussed the pay of the county HVAC Technician. Research of the ACCA Comparative Data on Alabama Counties and Salary.com reflected an increase would be justified. It was decided by the commissioners to place this issue on the agenda for Monday's meeting.

Commissioner Sammet said he is glad to see things moving on the old L&S site that is proposed to be the future site for engineering.

Commissioner Turner said with potholes multiplying, his crew is working on pothole maintenance and on the shoulders of the road. He reported his crew will be replacing a culvert under Pepper Road.

Commissioner Black reported his district is doing routine maintenance in preparation for spring road repairs. He said his district is continuing to have problems with political signs being placed on the county right of way, as well as, signs for real estate companies, churches and private businesses. He reported a farmer run over a sign and the tire was punctured by the sign post. He said there are signs everywhere on Burgreen and County Line Roads. If someone feels the need to place a sign, place them on public property and out of the right of way. His crew is removing signs off the county right of way and the confiscated signs can be picked up behind his county tool shed.

Chairman Daly announced the State of the City Address scheduled for January 30th and thanked everyone for attending.
