MINUTES, LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, MAY 30, 2018

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from May 21, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. today at the Washington Street Courthouse Annex, 310 West Washington Street, Athens, AL.

Present: Stanley Hill, Jason Black, and Ben Harrison. Absent: Steve Turner. Mark Yarbrough, Chairman presided.

County Engineer, Bryant Moss, gave an update regarding chip sealing, herbicide program, delivery of voting machines to polling locations and the purchase of a new asphalt roller.

Items were discussed for the June 5, 2018 agenda.

Stanley Hill reported that his district is chip sealing. He plans to install cameras at dump sites due to the ongoing littering problem.

Jason Black reiterated that littering has become a big problem. He announced his district had received a check from the City of Huntsville in the amount of \$26,361.23 for the recent work on sections of Mooresville and Burgreen Roads.

Ben Harrison reported his district had 11-downed trees to clear from last night's storm. He requested to add a resolution to Monday's agenda to sit down with department managers, before budget hearings, to discuss ways to cut \$600,000 total from the general fund to appropriate for roads. He gave a comparison between Limestone and Lauderdale Counties. He gave a report on the replacement cost for his tool shed that was destroyed in a previous storm.
