

MINUTES, LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, DECEMBER 27, 2017

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from December 18, 2017 at 10:00 a.m. today at the Washington Street Courthouse Annex, 310 West Washington Street, Athens, AL.

Present: Stanley Hill, Steve Turner, and Ben Harrison. Absent: Jason Black. Mark Yarbrough, Chairman presided.

Chairman Yarbrough presented Rickey Thompson with a retirement certificate.

MOTION was made by Steve Turner and seconded by Stanley Hill to suspend the Rules of Order to approve hiring a Corrections Officer.

The Administrator called the roll. Steve Turner, aye; Stanley Hill, aye; and Ben Harrison, aye. Motion carries unanimously.

MOTION was made by Steve Turner and seconded by Stanley Hill to approve to hire Kelsey Rogers as a Corrections Officer effective December 27, 2017, pending drug screening.

The Chairman asked if there was any discussion. There was no discussion. The Administrator called the roll. Steve Turner, aye; Stanley Hill, aye; and Ben Harrison, aye. Motion carries unanimously.

Items were discussed for the January 2, 2018 agenda.

Pam Ball discussed the floating holiday or floating personal day in-lieu of Good Friday proposed by Commissioner Harrison. She said current policy states an employee required to work an official holiday is paid for the hours worked and for holiday pay not to exceed 8 hours. The deputies and correctional officers work an 80.5-hour work period, 11.5 hours per work day. If a floating holiday is given, the 11.5-hour employee required to work would be paid for 8 hours, leaving the employee 3.5 hours short and if a floating personal day is given, then the county would be paying 3.5 hours more than we currently pay on the 11.5-hour employee. Commissioner Harrison said we would talk about it later, but leave it on the agenda.
