MINUTES, LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, DECEMBER 7, 2020 COMMISSION MEETING

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from November 16, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. today at the Clinton Street Courthouse Annex, 100 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama.

Present: Daryl Sammet, Danny Barksdale, Jason Black and LaDon Townsend. Absent: None. Collin Daly, Chairman presided

Items were discussed for the December 7, 2020 commission meeting agenda.

During the engineering report, Marc Massey reported that the engineering department would be selling some items on GovDeals and would place this on the next agenda. He requested that the monies received from the sale of the items would remain in the engineering department so that a request for a budget revision would not have to be done for the purchase of needed items.

Chairman Daly thanked Marc Massey and his crew for installing safety signs.

Chairman Daly suggested that December 31st, New Year's Eve, be given as a holiday and was added to the December 7th commission. meeting agenda.

Commissioner Barksdale commented that District 2 citizens had inquired as to the pickup of large debris. Commissioner Black commented that it is a service that Limestone County cannot afford. Commissioner Barksdale shared several local rates regarding garbage and debris pickup, and that he would continue "doing his homework" on this issue. Commissioner Barksdale also thanked Marc Massey for his attendance at a District 2 citizen's advisory meeting. Commissioner Barksdale and Marc Massey both agreed that the explanation of differences between county and municipal governments is a help to citizens.

Commissioner Black requested that the Commissioners provide mileage and VIN numbers for the dump trucks and low boy truck for submission to Russ Wood so that trucks can be given a guaranteed priced and then considered for auction.

Commissioner Townsend expressed his thankfulness and appreciation for his employees since becoming District 4 Commissioner. The employee's hard work has received a good response from the District 4 community, and he was very appreciative
