

LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, SEPTEMBER 6, 2022
WORK SESSION MINUTES

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from August 15, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. at the Clinton Street Courthouse Annex, 100 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama.

Present: Daryl Sammet, Danny Barksdale, Jason Black, and LaDon Townsend. Absent: None. Collin Daly, Chairman presided.

Sheriff Joshua McLaughlin addressed the Commission regarding a proposed contract with Turnkey Medical for inmate medical, and the concerns with the current inmate medical provider not providing staff as stated in their contract.

Ms. Tammy Parvin addressed the Commission regarding the future development proposed for Bluebird Lane and road safety issues that causes for the one laned road.

Judge Charles Woodroof addressed the Commission regarding his request to increase the proposed FY22-23 budget line item 849 in the amount of an additional \$2,390 due to unexpected repairs/replacements.

Ms. Sandy Smith of the Board of Registrars addressed the Commission requesting an increase in their salary due to their FY22-23 proposed budget showed a decrease in "temporary help".

Mr. Lynn Helms addressed the Commission regarding the potential water drainage issues in the area of Mooresville Road and Nick Davis Road.

Items were discussed for today's commission meeting agenda which included extra discussion surrounding the solid waste rate increases.

During the discussion of promoting Dennis Wallace as District 1 Road Supervisor, Commissioner Sammet expressed his appreciation to former District 1 Road Supervisor, Chris Davis. Commissioner Sammet stated, "After 34 years Chris has decided to retire. Chris has always been a really faithful employee and done the County a good job." The Chairman and Commissioner Black also expressed their appreciation to Chris Davis.

During the Engineer's Report, Marc Massey informed the Commission of the proposed cost of the environmental should the Commission decide to move forward with the property purchase which was discussed at the August 15th meeting.

Commissioner Barksdale reported that District 2 is finishing up the second round of bush hogging and complimented the striping crew and considered their work "outstanding". He also mentioned that in a couple of weeks, the paving crew would out on Mooresville, Southern Heritage, and Newby Roads and requested that citizens drive cautiously around them.

Chairman Daly stated that the month of September is recognized as "Gynecological", "Blood Cancer", "Childhood Cancer", and "Suicide" awareness month.
