LIMESTONE COUNTY COMMISSION, NOVEMBER 22, 2022, WORK SESSION MINUTES

The Limestone County Commission reconvened the meeting from November 16, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. at the Clinton Street Courthouse Annex, 100 South Clinton Street, Athens, Alabama.

Present: Daryl Sammet, Danny Barksdale, Derrick Gatlin, and LaDon Townsend. Absent: None. Collin Daly, Chairman presided.

Bethany Shockney addressed the Commission regarding the potential negotiation regarding the sale of a couple of acres in the Clyde Mabry Street Athens Commercial Park to Scout Pest Control. Ms. Shockney informed the Commission that the City of Athens has already approved to sale their portion of the property. Ms. Shockney also addressed the Commission regarding the ADECA grant for the sewer improvements at Pryor Field.

Items were discussed for today's commission meeting.

Commissioner Sammet and Commissioner Gatlin expressed their support of the services being offered by AirMedCare Network Services to county employees.

Commissioner Sammet reported that the budget revision listed was for septic repairs at the District 1 toolshed.

After the Engineer's Report, Commissioner Sammet questioned the "east of Elkton Rd" on the subdivisions of "New Garden Road Subdivision East" and "New Garden Road Subdivision West". Engineer Massey stated he would check during recess as to if this was an error.

Chairman Daly informed the Commission that EMA Director, Eddie Gilbert, requested that the approval for the Limestone County Emergency Operations Plan be removed from today's agenda.

Engineer Massey discussed extensively regarding the items listed on the agenda for the county taking on the solid waste collection and developing a solid waste collection department or continuing to outsource the solid waste services.

After Engineer Massey's explanation of the solid waste agenda items, Chairman Daly confirmed with Attorney Dill that the proper steps had been taken to cover same.

Chairman Daly expressed his appreciation to Steve Gatlin and CCS Garbage for the services that they provided to the county.

There was continued discussion surrounding the development of the solid waste collection department.
